in accordance with the Canadian Aviation Regulations (CAR), airline operators (CAR 705 operators) are required to establish an Approved Ground Icing Program (AGIP) that is subject to Transport Canada oversight. an AGIP is established to document specific procedures and processes for the operation of aircraft under ground icing conditions to ensure that safety of operations in winter conditions is not compromised. an AGIP is further necessary to ensure that personnel involved in the operations of aircraft under icing conditions understand their respective responsibilities and are properly trained, air operators conducting operations under CAR 702, 703 and 704, as well as foreign air carriers operating in Canada, are strongly encouraged by Transport Canada to develop and implement an AGIP as well.

a deficient or ineffective AGIP can increase costs and jeopardize operational efficiency and flight safety.
